

Temat: **There's no place like my home!** Ćwiczenia na rozumienie tekstu pisanego.

Cel lekcji:

1. Powtórzenie słownictwa dotyczącego tematu domu (pomieszczenia, meble).
2. Ćwiczenie umiejętności rozumienia tekstu pisanego.

1) Welcome to the English class.

2) Forma tekstu to *interview*, czyli wywiad.

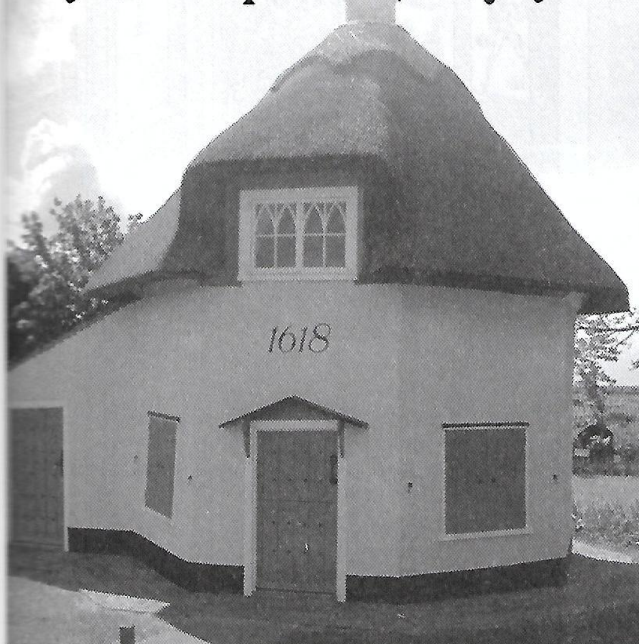
3) Na zakończenie poproszę Was o napisanie krótkiej wypowiedzi na temat:

There's no place like my home!



Dutch Cottage, in the town centre of Rayleigh in England, is very, very small. It is from the 1700s, so it is also very old. This tiny house has two other names: the Round House and the Octagonal Cottage. The second name is better, because this unusual home has eight sides. Each side is only eight feet (2.44 metres) long.

A young woman lives in the cottage but it is not hers. She pays rent to the council. For a small rent, she lives in an interesting and very different place. But ... the cottage is open to visitors! We ask her about it.

Interviewer: Your house is a very strange shape. What is it like inside? Is it difficult to live here?

Woman: I love living here! The ceilings are very low, but I'm not tall. I've got a tiny bathroom, and the kitchen is tiny too. I've got narrow stairs up to my bedroom. The bedroom, like the room downstairs, is round. There is a central chimney.

Interviewer: But what about the visitors? Does it feel like you live in a museum? Do tourists come in all the time?

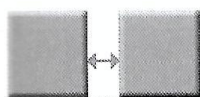
Woman: No, they don't. The cottage is open on Wednesday afternoons only. And only by appointment at other times. That means people phone me and ask if it's OK. I love that too. I often meet very nice people. I feel lucky to live here.

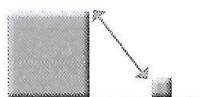

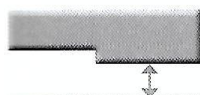
